

1 THE COURT: Okay. Looks to me like this is a good
2 break point, ladies and gentlemen.

3 I'm going to send you home for this evening.

4 There continues to be just a multitude of media
5 coverage that you must insulate yourselves against. It's on
6 the radio, it's on the TV, it's in the newspapers. You must
7 not read, see or hear anything. You must not conduct any
8 investigation on your own. You must not discuss this with
9 anyone, nor let anyone discuss it with you. You must keep
10 yourself apart and separate. That means turning it off, not
11 picking up the newspapers that have this in it, not watching
12 it on television.

13 And then to continue to have a pleasant evening.

14 Gentlemen, we will go at 9:00 o'clock in the morning.

15 What do I have on my docket?

16 Do I have some other things on the docket to begin
17 with? No.

18 So we will go at 9:00 o'clock in the morning, ladies
19 and gentlemen. If you will be here --

20 Just a moment, counselors. Will you approach the bench
21 for a moment?

22 (WHEREUPON both counsel approached the bench and
23 conferred privately with the Court.)

24 THE COURT: Then, ladies and gentlemen, if you will be
25 here at five of 9:00 in the morning, we will do our best to
