THE COURT: Okay, ladies and gentlemen.

MR. BURCH: Your Honor, for the record, we have no surrebuttal either.

THE COURT: The evidence is all in, ladies and gentlemen. That doesn't mean that the case is over, because you haven't heard the arguments of these lawyers and you haven't heard my instructions on the law and you haven't heard the viewpoints of each other in the jury room.

So, by that oath that you took you are still sworn to keep your mind open and not deliberate the case because you have to hear all of the rest of this before you can start deliberating, and you have to be in the jury room before you can deliberate, all of you, 12 of you. We will reduce your number to 12.

The lawyers and I have some work to do.

Then tomorrow morning we will start in with the closing arguments. And then later on, after they're finished, I will give you the instructions on the law, and then you will start your deliberations after I have reduced your number down.

So again, tonight, on the local press there is a front page story again, so you are going to avoid that. I'm sure that it's on the radio and probably on the television stations because their cameras have been here. So again you are going to have to be careful to insulate yourself to not

1 read, see or hear, or to allow anyone to talk to you, or to
2 talk to anyone about the case, or to conduct any
3 investigation on your own.

4 But do have a -- drive carefully going home.

5 Have a pleasant evening.

6 And we will see you back here tomorrow morning --

7 Counselors, would you please approach the bench for a
8 minute?

9 (WHEREUPON both counsel approached the bench and
10 conferred privately with the Court.)

11 THE COURT: All right, ladies and gentlemen. If you
12 will be back here at five minutes of 9:00 in the morning,
13 it's our intentions to get started at 9:00 a.m.

14 Have a pleasant evening.

15 Recess Court.

16 Then before you do that, I'd ask counselors in the next
17 five minutes to come to my chambers, please.

18 THE BAILIFF: Court's adjourned.
